**How Do We Say it...?**

The wonder of God's grace towards the people of the Mexican Sonoran Desert along the Arizona border continues. I believe we are seeing nothing short of a Spiritual Awakening. For instance, a pastor from Sasabe, Sonora, Mexico told Sharing Ministries Church in Tucson a couple of weeks ago that he was seeing about 140 new converts a week. ...And that has been going on for months! Since Sasabe is a town of about 900 (near the border), it may mean that **more people have been saved than the total population of the town!** Thurleen asked about how follow up is being done. Well, it was reported that the little church is having 5-hour services, 7 days a week!

When we returned from our summer Partnership Tour we were impatient to be able to confirm the stories of large numbers of people coming to Christ in that area. We were assured by Tucson pastor Rob Landry that the "979 number" I reported in our last NewsLetter was accurate, to any degree that we can know. ...But he said that the number of salvations may be more like **six to seven thousand!**

We praise God for his harvest of souls! It is humbling to even know about what God is doing in this great outpouring. It appears that at the current time doors have been broken open for the advance of the Gospel.

This last year we have been very cautious about not naming the Christians who, last February, bravely took the gospel into Northwest Mexican areas that so many said were far too dangerous. Now the Awakening has taken on a life of its own. Its success was not from organized or denominational efforts or programs. No great "revival tents" with loud-speakers were brought in. Just a handful of obedient Christians who patiently "connect the dots" on the "paint by number" canvas that the Holy Spirit reveals a little at a time. Now we hear about how eager sinners are standing outside of tiny packed churches to hear about the Christ who can save them from their sin.

Our prayer is that this hunger for the Gospel will spill over into the United States through her "original residents" here in the Arizona Sonoran Desert.

Along with Mexicans who are receiving Christ as their personal Savior, there are also converts from many other countries of the world. As we looked at a map of Mexico, pastor Landry said, "you know, the world looks at Mexico as the way into the United States."

In addition to Mexico, there are known to be people from several Central American countries, South America, even from Australia and the Middle East who have received Christ in the amazing move of God.

**Baptist Indian Fellowship**

The BIF (Baptist Indian Fellowship), a 50 year old group of various Indian churches, now led by Felix Juan, has concluded that they must become mission active.

Felix is Tohono O'dham and his mother still lives in the Hikiwan district. He has graciously made himself available to fill the Hikiwan Pulpit several times this year. The BIF leadership has taken action to begin an ongoing outreach in and around Hikiwan. They

are planning a two day ministry effort, in February or March. As a Native American group, I believe they will be able to open doors for the Gospel, perhaps as never before.

The timing of their ministry efforts just may beautifully coordinate with the move of the Holy Spirit directly across the US / Mexico border. Pray that it does...

## Perspective...

**But Mary kept (treasured up) all these things, and pondered them in her heart...**

*I* was a night like no other. In the fields outside Bethlehem, young shepherd boys knew the importance of guarding their flocks through the long nights. Their sheep were bred to be the most perfect in the land. Their purpose was special. Not for the quality of their wool, or the flavor of their meat. When these lambs were ready, their destiny was set. It was at Bethlehem where the sheep pens were filled with, well, sacrificial lambs. Bethlehem is about six miles from Jerusalem and the holy temple of Jehovah. The Temple had, for a time, been filled with the presence of God. Hebrews remembered, and some yearned for God's return.

Yet even though the Hebrews were the people of God, as individuals, their relationship with God required a sacrifice to atone for their sin. They would buy a lamb from the sheep merchants at Bethlehem and present it to the priests at the Temple.

But this night was special. It held the best of good news. Seekers...sinners hungry for enduring righteousness but never able to keep it, tho repeatedly offering blood sacrifices, can...now, by faith in the perfect Lamb of God born to die for mankind...be saved eternally!

The shepherd boys immediately knew it was an grand moment when the angels announced that "A Saviour who is Christ the Lord is born." They ran "with haste" and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby Jesus lying in a manger.
